What is it about?

This research is a part of my doctoral thesis. Archival practices are fundamentally a matter of discrimination and selection. Too often our stories are silenced, erased, fetishised or represented as one without addressing our differences within.

In my research I aim to collect oral histories of LGBTIQ migrants, refugees and asylum seekers. I will develop a new methodology for archival creation that aims to challenge normative archival practices that will respectfully organize our stories.

I want to preserve stories of LGBTIQ culturally linguistically diverse people who were compelled to leave their countries because of homophobia, discrimination, and persecution. This research will establish the world's first open digital archive of LGBTIQ stories of forced migration.
